DAY TO DAY ITINERARY



Wednesday 02 August

Home – Santiago

Today we fly to Santiago, crossing the international dateline en route. On arrival into Santiago this afternoon, we will be met and transferred to our hotel.

Thursday 03 August

Santiago (B,D)

This morning, we enjoy a sightseeing tour of the city, beginning at the Civic Centre, the focal point of which is the neoclassical La Moneda Palace. We continue through the narrow streets of the downtown area to the Pre-Columbian Museum displaying remnants of ancient cultures. We proceed to the Plaza de Armas, a picturesque square and the 18th century Cathedral Metropolitana. Nearby, housed

in an exquisite 19th century wrought-iron building are the Central Markets where a colourful conglomeration of seafood, fruits, vegetables and flowers are on sale. We stroll along Parque Forestal, past the Fine Arts Museum to Santa Lucia Hill where the city was founded in 1541 and which is now a sanctuary of gardens and fountains. Tonight we enjoy our first dinner together.

Friday 04 August

Sanitago – Buenos Aires (B, D)

Today we fly to Buenos Aires, crossing the Andes mountain range en route. On arrival into Buenos Aires this afternoon, we will be met and transferred to our hotel, located in Recoleta, the city's most exclusive area.



Saturday 05 August

Buenos Aires (B, D)

This morning enjoy a sightseeing tour of Buenos Aires, visiting the most important highlights of the city. Beginning at Plaza de Mayo Square, we then visit Mayo Avenue and the oldest residential neighbourhood in Buenos Aires; San Telmo. Other highlights include, Puerto Madero, Palermo, Recoleta, the colourful neighbourhood of La Boca, where tango first originated in the late 1800's, and Recoleta Cemetery, the famous and final resting place of "Evita". This afternoon is at leisure. This evening you will be transported back in time thanks to the La Ventana tango show. Enjoy the dancers, orchestras and local singers, while dining from the impressive menu that offers both local and international cuisine as well as an extensive list of Argentinean wines.

Sunday 06 August

Buenos Aires (B, D)

Today you have the day free to explore Buenos Aires. You could opt to make your way to San Telmo, where every Sunday they have the famous Antique Markets, you could choose to take a day tour to Colonia. Or simply just relax! This evening we enjoy dinner at a local steakhouse.

Monday 07 August

San Isidro – Tigre Delta (B, D)

This morning, admire Buenos Aires from the Rio de la Plata as you travel by catamaran to the Tigre Delta. On arrival, transfer to Paseo Victoria, the most important neighbourhood in Tigre, and then to Puerto de Frutos. You will also see San Isidro, visit the towns historical centre and Cathedral,



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and the Presidential Residence in Olivos, before returning to the city. The afternoon is at leisure. Enjoy dinner at the hotel tonight.

Tuesday 08 August

Buenos Aires – Iguazu Falls (B, D)

This morning we return to the airport and join a flight to Cataratas del Iguazú, the main base for visiting the famed Iguazu Falls. On arrival, we will be transferred to our hotel and this evening, we embark on an unforgettable evening at “The Argentine Experience” – a unique dining experience which blends exquisite food, endless boutique wine, local culture and social integration. Led by a charismatic guide, learn how to make traditional empanadas, make your own alfajores, and learn the history and etiquette of ‘mate’, Argentina’s traditional caffeine-rich infused drink.

Wednesday 09 August

Iguazu Falls – Argentinean Side (B, D)

Early this morning we visit the Iguazu Falls on the Argentinian side. We take the Rainforest Ecological train where we enjoy panoramic views from above and below the waterfalls. During our visit we will embark on the “Great Adventure Boat Ride” under the falls so prepare to get wet. We then visit the Devils Gorge, which is said to be one of the most spectacular falls and a major highlight of Iguazu Falls.

Thursday 10 August

Brazilian Falls & Exotic Bird Park – Rio de Janeiro (B, D)

Today we see the falls from the Brazilian side of the border as we board buses for a tour of the park. From the Brazilian



side, there are breath-taking views of the Floriana Falls, the Devil's Gorge Canyon and the Iguazu River. Continuing on, we visit Parque das Aves, an ecological bird sanctuary, home to more than 900 birds of 150 different species. The visit allows direct contact with bird species that rarely could be seen elsewhere. At the conclusion of the tour, we will be transferred to the airport for our onward flight to Rio de Janeiro. On arrival into Rio, we will be met and transferred to our hotel.

Friday 11 August

Corcovado & Sugarloaf (B, L)

This morning begins at Corcovado Hill. Travel 4km by vehicle through the Tijuca Forest, the world's largest urban National Park, before arriving at Christ the Redeemer where we can experience

a panoramic lookout of the city. We also see Maracana Stadium, the Sambadrome and the Metropolitan Cathedral, before passing through the famous arches of Lapa en-route to Copacabana. We have a traditional Brazilian BBQ lunch before visiting the famous Sugarloaf Mountain with views across the entire city. Tonight is at your leisure.

Saturday 12 August

Rio de Janeiro – Culinary Experience Tour (B,L)

We believe that the best way to get to know a city is by strolling along the streets, eating the food and rubbing shoulders with the locals. You won't find the true spirit of Rio in the flashy bars and tourist-traps of Ipanema – you'll find it in the bustling street markets and little bars and restaurants



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that have been favourites with the locals for generations. Our culinary walking tour will take us through the neighbourhoods of Lapa, Glória, Flamengo and Laranjeiras. We taste Amazonian fruit juices, visit a street market, bars and some of Rio's older restaurants – in total we make 8 stops and finish up with a big meal and plenty of caipirinhas for those who are thirsty.

Sunday 13 August

Rio de Janeiro (B,D)

Today is a free day for you to relax on one of Rio's famous beaches such as Ipanema or Copacabana, or explore the city further at your leisure. Dinner is included at the hotel this evening.

Monday 14 August

Rio – Lima (B)

This morning is at leisure for you to explore Rio. A late check-out has been provided, before a late evening flight to Lima. Lima, the capital of Peru is one of South America's largest cities and known as the

'Gastronomical Capital of the Americas', encompassing specialties from traditional coastal cooking to a refined global fare. Lima is home to various museums including Museo Larco & Museo de la Nacion and even boasts several of the top restaurants in the world. On arrival in Lima, we are met and transferred to the hotel.

Tuesday 15 August

Lima (B,L,D)

Following breakfast, we embark on a Gastronomic Tour. We begin at the Peruvian markets before making our way to an exclusive Peruvian restaurant where we will learn to prepare the famous "Ceviche" and "Pisco Sour". Later you will enjoy a delicious lunch, consisting of the most symbolic dishes of Peruvian cuisine. Tonight, we head to a local restaurant for our evening meal.

Wednesday 16 August

Lima Pachacamac Museum (B, D)

Today you will visit the sacred Pachacamac. An archaeological site located 31 kilometres from Lima it is made up of pyramids and temples which date back to 200 – 300 BC. Wander through the grounds and marvel at the Sun God shrine and the Palace of the Chosen Women before visiting the site museum to view the ceramics, textiles and idols found in the original temple of Pachacamac. Tonight dinner is enjoyed at another great local restaurant.



Thursday 17 August

Lima – Reserva Amazonica (B, D)

This morning transfer to the airport for our outward flight from Lima. On arrival in Puerto Maldonado, we transfer to the pier for a 45-minute boat trip to our accommodation at Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica – a gracious rainforest lodge, adjacent to the lush Tambopata National Reserve. Spy on the secret lives of the world's largest rodent, the Capybara, search for elusive caimans and gigantic tarantulas by flashlight on a twilight river cruise or night walk, or if you prefer, head along to the nature presentation at the Eco Centre, followed by cocktails and dinner.

Friday 18 August

Amazon (B, L, D)

After breakfast, enjoy an excursion to Lake Sandoval along with the Inkaterra Canopy Walkway & Anaconda Walk. Lake Sandoval is a beautiful, mirror-like oxbow lake that is home to the endangered giant river otter, as well as red howler monkeys, macaws, prehistoric hoatzins, also called “shanshos”, point-tailed palm creepers and side-neck turtles. The canopy walkway and anaconda walk offers views unimaginable from below. Be on the lookout for different bird species such as toucans, woodpeckers, trogons and more.

Saturday 19 August

Amazon (B, L, D)

After breakfast, enjoy a motorised canoe ride to Gamitana creek. Take in the sights, scents, and sounds of the jungle as you meander through the rainforest, along the banks of a dark-water creek that is home to piranha, caimans, turtles and an abundance of vibrant birds, towards “Sanipanga”. We then travel by canoe downstream to the Gamitana Model Farm to learn about an Amazon model farm and have the chance to make your own plantain flour which is used for breakfast in the nearby lodges. The afternoon is at leisure before we enjoy dinner together tonight.

Sunday 20 August

Amazon – Cusco (B,D)

After a buffet breakfast, we return to Puerto Maldonado by outboard motorised canoe to catch our flight to Cusco. On arrival into Cusco, we are met and transferred to hotel where we will enjoy dinner together.

Monday 21 August

Cusco (B, D)

This morning we begin a sightseeing tour, showing us the highlights of Cusco. See the 12-Angled Rock, Qorikancha Temple of the Sun, and the Cathedral, built on the ruins of an Inca palace. We also see Qenqo (giant rock), Puca Pucara, the Water Temple of Tambomachay, and more. The



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afternoon is left free for you to explore Cusco. This evening, we have dinner at Tunupa Museo Restaurant which features an exotic fusion of flavours and experience.

Tuesday 22 August

Sacred Valley Full Day Tour (B, L, D)

We begin our tour of the Sacred Valley at the village of Pisac, situated at the base of a spectacular Inca fortress perched on a mountain spur. On market days Pisac erupts with locals in traditional dress selling fruit and vegetables, as well as homemade crafts. There is time to explore the markets before lunch is served at a local restaurant. We continue the tour along the River Urubamba, to Ollantaytambo, the best surviving example of an Inca city, with narrow cobblestone streets that have been continuously inhabited since the 13th century. At the conclusion of the tour, travel by the modern Vistadome train to Aguas Calientes, featuring glass ceilings and panoramic views of the Andes mountain range.

Wednesday 23 August

Machu Picchu (B, D)

Located 2,430 metres above sea level on a mountain ridge, above the Sacred Valley is where you will find Machu Picchu, the most famous of all Inca sites and one of the new Seven Wonders of the World. This

awe-inspiring ancient city was abandoned prior to the Spanish colonisation by the Incas and the ruins have remained in extraordinary condition. We see the Main Square, Circular Tower, the Sacred Solar Clock, the Temple of the Three Windows and the Cemeteries, and more. This afternoon, we return by the Vistadome train to Ollantaytambo. Tonight you will enjoy a dinner & show at Don Antonio.

Thursday 24 August

Cusco (B, D)

This day has been left free for you to enjoy Cusco at your leisure. The city has a long and interesting history dating back to 1200AD and is the continent's oldest continuously inhabited city. Narrow, cobble-stoned streets lined by Inca walls stretch out from the main plaza in every direction. Many of the colonial buildings were built on top of Incan foundations and the stonework is unmatched in its precision and beauty. Here, visitors to Cusco can get a glimpse of the richest heritage of any South American city. We enjoy dinner tonight at a local grill restaurant.

Friday 25 August

Cusco – Puno (B,L,D)

This morning we travel one of the most beautiful train routes in the world as we take the spectacular luxury Peru Rail



Lake Titicaca train journey through to Puno. As we farewell Cusco and travel through to Lake Titicaca, enjoy the fresh air from the open-air observatory car, allowing you to take in the majestic views while enjoying the typical music and dances of the Peruvian highlands. On arrival in Puno later this evening, you will be met transferred to our hotel.

Saturday 26 August

Uros & Taquile Islands (B, D)

Early this morning we travel by motorboat to the floating reed islands of Uros, an archipelago of more than 60 floating islands inhabited by the Uros, an ethnic group of fishermen. Here, we explore the islands by an authentic reed raft, before returning to Puno later this afternoon. The remainder of the day at leisure before enjoying dinner at the hotel later tonight.

Sunday 27 August

Puno – Lima (B,D)

This morning we check out and transfer through to Juliaca to catch our onward flight to Lima. Enroute we stop to take in the pre-Inca burial ground of Sillustani. Here you can wander through the remarkable tombs built from volcanic stone, known as Chullpas which reach heights of up to 12 metres. Overlooking the beautiful lake Umayo, Sillustani is considered to be

one of the most important necropolises in the world. On arrival into Lima, we are met and transferred to hotel. Tonight, we come together to enjoy our final dinner together at La Dama Juana Restaurant. Immerse yourself in Peruvian culture during a performance of traditional dance and music, and tuck into a delicious buffet dinner of typical Peruvian cuisine.

Monday 28 August

Lima – Santiago – Auckland (B)

Today we are met and transferred to the airport in time to join our outward flight from Lima. We travel from Lima to Auckland via Santiago.

Wednesday 30 August

Arrive Auckland

Arrival time is early morning.



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
